

Camper Education

Camp staff have received the appropriate training to be able to educate our campers on procedures in place at camp. We will be educating our campers in an age appropriate manner on the following information:

Handwashing

Washing hands is easy, and it's one of the most effective ways to prevent the spread of germs. Clean hands can stop germs from spreading from one person to another and campers will be taking frequent breaks to wash and/or sanitize their hands throughout the day. The following steps will be followed when handwashing:

1. **Wet** your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.
2. **Lather** your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
3. **Scrub** your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice.
4. **Rinse** your hands well under clean, running water.
5. **Dry** your hands using a clean paper towel or air dry them.

Mask up!

Camper will be required to have mark on if they can't keep a social distance from other campers and pods. Camp staff will educate the campers on the important as to why they need to wear their mask.

COVID Signs and Symptoms

Camp staff will educate the campers on the signs and symptoms of COVID. Campers will be educated to stay home when ill, proper respiratory etiquette, face coverings, reporting an illness within their family household. Camp staff will educate children on where and where they shouldn't travel to. This is for their safety and for their fellow campers.

Shared Objects

Discourage camper to share items that are difficult to clean, sanitize, or disinfect. Educate the campers as to why. Keep each camper's belongings separated from others' and in individually labeled containers, cubbies, or areas.

Quest camp has ensured adequate supplies to minimize sharing of high-touch materials to the extent possible (e.g., assign art supplies or other equipment to a single camper), or limit use of supplies and equipment to one group of campers at a time and clean and disinfect between use.

Each camper will have their own bag with art supplies that they can use for the week. The supplies in each bag have been clean and sanitized at the end of the each week.

Camp staff will educate camper to avoid sharing electronic devices, toys, books, and other games or learning aids.

Camp staff will educate the campers how important it is to clean before and after lunch/ snack times. Camp staff will also educate the campers to eat their own food and not to share with other campers.

Physical Barriers and Guides

During sport games or physical activities, campers will learn physical distance games to play at camp and be able to bring these home to play with families and friends.

Physical barriers tap/ dots/ cones has been added to the camp ground to make sure camps are educated and remain at least 6 feet apart.

Ventilation

Camp staff will keep windows open in the classroom to increase air floor as much as possible. Camp staff will inform the campers as to why the windows are staying open.
