Staff Health Screening on Arrival to Camp

Because COVID-19 appears to be easily transmitted via droplets, and possibly from asymptomatic carriers, the CDC recommends all camps to conduct a temperature check and health assessment upon the child's arrival to camp.

The Camp Medic will greet the Staff member upon arrival. The Camp medic will conduct the health screen wearing gloves, a mask and a face shield:

1. Make a visual inspection of the staff member for signs of illness, which could include flushed cheeks, rapid breathing or difficulty breathing (without recent physical activity), fatigue, or extreme fussiness, and confirm that the camper is not experiencing coughing or shortness of breath.
2. The Camp Medic will conduct a health screen of questions
3. The Camp Medic will reach and check the Staff Members temperature using a no touch thermometer. If you use disposable or non-contact (temporal) thermometers and you did not have physical contact with the staff member, you do not need to change gloves before the next check.
4. The Camp Medic will confirm the temperature with the staff member.
5. The Camp Medic will clean the non-contact thermometer with an alcohol wipe between each staff member.

Any staff member with the above symptoms or a temperature of 100.4 F or more will not be allowed to stay. This will be shared with the staff member in a discrete manner. The Camp Medic will inform the staff member that the camper may return to camp after being fever free for 72 hours.
